She kept her promise. The war of evil had stopped and she began to climb spiritually. When her life was ending and St. Zoimos came to commune her he saw a face bright and angelic. She died on Holy Thursday. According to the Orthodox teachings there are three crosses: 1. Various incidents of life such as temptations and tribulations. 2. The struggle for transformations of the passions and 3. The visions of God; which is the taste of real life.
