The second theme for forgiveness is emphasized in the Gospel and in a special ceremony of mutual forgiveness in the evening Vespers. Before we enter the Great Fast we are reminded that there can be no true fast or repentance or reconciliation with God unless we reconcile with one another. I was once told it is not what goes into your mouth when you fast but what comes out of your mouth.
